1st Means of Evaluation	Means of Evaluation	Students' achievement of this outcome will be assessed using a writing assignment selected by the instructor as appropriate for the learning outcome.	
	Target	70% of students will be rated as "meets expectations" or "exceeds expectations" for each criterion on the rubric.	
	Data Source	All students enrolled in a First Year Seminar in the spring semester will be assessed on this outcome by the seminar instructor.	
	Means of Scoring	Student work will be scored using a standardized rubric by faculty members teaching the courses. Scores will be reported for each criterion on the rubric in raw numbers for each scale point category. Librarians will receive results for further analysis and review.	
2nd Means of Evaluation	Means of Evaluation	First Year Students will be tested on their knowledge of selected FYS information literacy goals through a pre-test and post-test of 7 questions. The pre-test will be administered in August and September of 2012. The post-test will be administered in April of 2013.	
	Target	70% of the students will score 80% or better on the post-test in April 13.	
2nd Mea	Data Source	The pre-test and post-test will be administered through the use of Captivate quiz software. Results will be provided through the quiz generator software on Blackboard. Our goal is that 90% of all first year students will complete the tests.

1st Means of Evaluation	Means of Evaluation	Circulation statistics from the library's Voyager system will be used to compare use from FY 11-12 to FY 12-13. These years will provide a comparison of use in their previous location in Boatwright to their new location in the Music Library. Data will assist the Head, Music Library to promote the collection and assess its effectiveness in a new location.			
	Target	The past year and the upcoming year will provide baseline data on the number of Dance materials that are circulated to both students and faculty. We anticipate a 10% increase in circulation.			
1st Means o	Data Source	Circulation Statistics from the library's voyager system.			
	Means of Scoring	Statistical Reports for the call numbers of dance materials will be analyzed by the Head of the Music Library. Comparisons will be made on the circulation numbers in FY 11-12 and FY 12-13 and reported in an Excel spreadsheet.

		Data for the FYS assessment will assist us in demonstrating how the library contributes to student learning at the university, with an emphasis on the information literacy goals of the FYS Curriculum.			
How will data be used to make decisions?		The continued study of Rare Books and Special Collections will assist us with identifying ways to develop a more robust service and promotion of these unique materials. The data may also assist us in future space planning for Rare Books and Special Collections.			
		Circulation data for the dance materials will assist the Head of the Music Library in making decisions about promoting the collection to faculty and staff and how they can utilize the material for research assignments.			
How will results be shared?		Results will be discussed and shared with the Library Assessment Committee, the University Librarian and staff who are conducting the various studies. We will also share the results with all library staff through a scheduled Library Assessment Forum. Results from the FYS assessment will be shared with FYS faculty .
