Boatwright Memorial Library

Boatwright Memorial Library houses materials for the humanities, social sciences, sciences, business, and leadership studies. The collections consist of books, journals, newspapers, government document information, various electronic databases, media resources and rare books/special collections. Parsons Music Library contains music scores and music CDs, in addition to books and videos about all types of music.

Locating Materials

Books and More

You can check the library's discovery system, *OneSearch*, from off campus by going to the library's website and searching *OneSearch* or the *Books and More* tab at the top of the page or using the *Books and More* (catalog) link under Quick Links. *Books and More* also includes music CDs, DVDs, recorded books, and government publications.

Access to Library Databases

The University Libraries and Alumni Office provide special off-campus online access to JSTOR, a digital library of academic journals, books, and primary sources. To use this databases, log in to your alumni account at uronline.net. Alumni may also use all of the library's databases on-site by visiting the libraries and requesting a one day computer guest account.

The Collegian is now online. You can search the archive (1914–2013) by going to the Databases tab. In the "C" section, choose *Collegian* archive.

Rare Books & Special Collections

Located within Boatwright Library, the Galvin Rare Book Room and Special Collections supports the educational mission of the University of Richmond by preserving and providing access to our diverse collection of materials for use by students, faculty, staff, scholars, alumni and the general public.

Parsons Music Library Collections

Materials available to alumni include music scores; CD recordings; books about music; music journals; and multimedia CD-ROMs. Services include music reference, online searching, and photocopying.

International Film Series

During the fall and spring semesters, the International Film Series (IFS) offers Richmond audiences access to expert-curated, contemporary and classic films from around the world, uniquely paired with commentary and audience discussion. Free and open to the public, all films are screened in their original language with English subtitles. Friday afternoon screenings feature live introductions and faculty-led post-film discussion. *May be online in Fall 2020 due to COVID-19.
